We are currently accepting applications for a summer research position at the Center for Healthy Minds at UW-Madison under the direction of Dr. Christy Wilson-Mendenhall. We offer a flexible paid internship position starting in May or June 2019 and ending in August 2019, with the likelihood to extend into subsequent semesters. This position is ideal for undergraduates who are interested in conducting research at the intersection of social psychology, cognitive psychology, contemplative practice, and emotion. Interns are involved in conducting studies, acquiring data, scoring and analyzing data, and attending weekly lab meetings. This internship is ideal for those interested in pursuing a graduate degree in psychology, neuroscience, or medicine. Individuals hoping to complete a senior thesis project or interested in working with data are encouraged to apply. Hours will range from 20 to 35 hours a week, depending on tasks and availability.
